## Stage 1

So far, we are revising some basic mathematics skills and reading lots of stories together to assist with building our vocabulary. Students are also putting into practice classroom expectations for working in group activities, remembering to share and work together as a team to complete set tasks.

## Stage 2

Stage 2 teachers are excited to be teaching the students in Years 3 and 4 this year. We welcome the Year 2 children into Amethyst. This term will be filled with lots of new learning. We will be continuing with our Guided Reading groups. Students' comprehension skills will be further developed by engaging in quality books each day. In Maths we will be focusing on place value with 3 and 4-digit numbers and using these numbers in addition and subtraction. In History and Science the students will be guided in asking questions and then researching and investigating the answers while learning about when the first Europeans came to Australia and the life cycles of living things.

## Stage 3

Stage 3 this year is made up of 3 class - 5/6 Emerald (Mrs Parker), 5/6 Lime (Miss Peulic) and 4/5 Olive (Mrs Kumar). All classes and students have had a fantastic and very settled start to the year. We have jumped straight into our work and have been busy working on creating texts that are imaginative, using our mathematical skills to add, subtract and using place value to multiply and divide.

This term we also have some exciting topics in our other Key Learning Areas. In Science our topic is desert survivors, in PDH students are learning about safe living and in History we are learning about Australia as a nation.

During the term students will be exposed to co-teaching where 2 teachers co-teach in the classroom. Mrs Tuddenhem will be co-teaching history lessons with Stage 3 teachers and these lessons will be inquiry based.

I am looking forward to a productive, enjoyable and successful year with Stage 3 this year! Mrs Parker
