

#### **RETURN & EARN**

Thank you to everyone that has been saving containers for our new 'Return and Earn' scheme. We have already collected over 3000 containers in the first week. This means that \$300 will come back to Busby to spend on equipment and initiatives for our students and we are also helping the environment by keeping plastic out of landfill. Eligible containers include cans, water bottles, soft drink bottles, poppers and small milk and juice containers. Please remember that glass can't be accepted for safety reasons and to please rinse out any milk containers as they start smelling pretty quickly.
