Highlights for the term:

FIRE—Dragon of Courage


EARTH—Dragon of Responsibility

K-2

Students in K-2 have had a fantastic start to the new year! Kindergarten have begun to have fun exploring their new school and getting to know and make new friends. They have been learning about what school rules are and why we need to follow them to keep safe. This term they have been learning about the letters of the alphabet and the sounds they make which help them to read and write. During Mathematics our Kindergarten students are learning about numbers; how to count, number recognition, ordering and writing numbers and counting groups of objects to get a total. They are definitely becoming little independent people who are proud to show me their great work, and I am very proud of their achievements so far.

In Stage 1, we have also been very busy with learning class rules and expectations, why we need to be safe and how to be a good friend. We have hit the ground running with our spelling this term, learning about spelling rules and to think about what a spelling pattern looks like in a word, does it look right when we record it? Or is there another way to spell the word. Spelling is quite tricky, not only is it hearing a sound but also visual. Does it look right? In writing, we have been looking at characters in books that may be food or kitchen utensils. Student have had fun coming up with utensil names and then creating human-like features such as a face, legs and arms. You will be glad to hear that yes, your children do know what a fry pan is or a measuring jug or even a spatula and whisk!!
