IMPORTANT Asthma information-

Parents and caregivers need to provide information from their child's medical practitioner EACH YEAR including an Asthma Action Plan. The plan must be signed by your child's doctor. You will also need to supply an inhaler for use at school. The Action Plan for asthma is to be followed if the student has an asthma attack at school or to prevent an attack. If your child has an asthma plan, it is important to let us know.

IMPORTANT Anaphylaxis information-

Parents and caregivers need to provide information from their child's medical practitioner EACH YEAR including an ASCIA Anaphylaxis Action Plan. The plan must be signed by your child's doctor. You will also need to supply an adrenaline auto-injector for use at school. The ASCIA action plan for anaphylaxis is to be followed if the student has an anaphylactic reaction at school.

Please find the link below to assist you: if your child is diagnosed at risk of a severe allergic reaction, particularly anaphylaxis, the Anaphylaxis Procedures contain information designed to minimise the risk to students. If your child has an allergy, it is important to let us know.

Meet Mrs Tuddenham

My name is Mrs Belinda Tuddenham and this year I am the Learning Support and Wellbeing Assistant Principal, meaning that I work with all staff members that are supporting students with their learning in the classroom and in the playground and lead or co-ordinate programs that add to the wellbeing of students.

I am also co-teaching with staff in Stages 1, 2 and 3. When coteaching, students use the school laptops as a learning tool, and focus on history and geography using the inquiry learning process. During this time the students form their own questions on the given topic, conduct research, evaluate and analyse their information and then present their learning using a Google app (such as Google Classroom, Google Docs, Google Slides or Google Sites). Feedback from students shows that they always enjoy their learning when using technology and value having additional staff in the classroom as it not only helps develop their inquiry skills but also helps them become more confident and skilled in using the laptops. Staff have also indicated that this is a time that they value as not only are student learning outcomes optimised, but teachers are upskilled in technology as well as authentic ways to embed technology in their teaching and learning programs.

In 2023, I continue to only work 2 days a week at Busby Public School (Monday & Tuesday) as the other days I am at home being a mum to my busy 4-year-old daughter.

Award Systems

We would like to explain the systems we have in place to award our students here at Busby Public School.

Attendance Awards

Attendance Awards are given out by classroom teachers to those students who have been at school for a whole week, commencing on the Monday of each week.

Once students have collected 5 of these awards, they hand them into their class teacher. Students are then given an Attendance Award at our fortnightly whole school assemblies.

These students then go into the draw to win an iPad Mini. The iPad Mini draws occur once a semester. The winner will be drawn prior to going on the School Holiday break of the July holidays and Christmas holidays.

Class Awards

Our students receive class awards from teachers across all Key Learning Areas. Teachers can hand these out at any time for outstanding work or effort in classroom lessons. At our fortnightly whole school assembly, teachers award 3 students, one for English, Mathematics and any other area.

Students need to collect 5 of these to then gain a Bronze Award. When they collect another 5, they are then awarded a Silver Award and so on up to Platinum. As students gain each award over the year, we hold an event as a reward for their efforts. These are held in the last week of a term.

Busby Bucks

Busby Bucks are earned by students, either on the playground or in the classroom. Students who have been 'caught' following school rules or simply being a good friend are rewarded for their actions. Students get to shop with their 'Busby Bucks' at our Market Day Stall which is held at the end of each term.

- Manoeuvres such as U-turns and 3-point turns are dangerous during the busy school drop-off and pick-up times.




Keeping your children safe when dropping off and picking up at school:
