Aboriginal Education Classes

We are in the process of organising a family meeting to get some input from our families as to what you would like to see in these classes. Some of our students have already shared their ideas. We have connected with Ashcroft Public School and Liverpool Public School in a dance program for our senior students.

ILSP—Intensive Learning Support Program

We have an amazing group of teachers working with many of our students in the ILSP program to push and challenge our students to learn and improve. Our focus is Literacy and Numeracy in these sessions designed to give targeted intervention to help your child grow and improve in their learning. These are small groups working with a teacher.

Integration of our students and other fun activities

We are excited to announce that after some parent suggestion and having the Learning and Wellbeing officers out, it was decided that we would as a school move to integrate our Support Unit into the mainstream during breaks.

There was a lot of preparation and practice for this but we can say it was a huge success! We wanted our school to be inclusive and rich with diversity. Our senior students have been helping our little buddies transition from one end of the school to the other end. Deputy Principal's Message

Dear families,

I would like to thank you for the warm welcome I have received since starting at Busby Public School!

Students and teachers in K-2 have been engaging with the new curriculum for English and Mathematics. We have been working hard to establish our foundational literacy skills, including knowledge of the alphabetic code and to develop essential numeracy skills in our early years. Through our units we have been saying and matching graphemes and phonemes, blending and decoding to read texts and using drawings to support planning and writing. In maths, we have been identifying part-whole relationships in numbers as well as modelling and recognising combinations for numbers up to ten. The numbers 0-9 are the only numbers most of us will ever need to learn. It is important to know everything there is to know about each number.

How can you help at home?

Read aloud with your children everyday. Ten minutes for each child around a book of his/her choice. If English is your second language, read in your home language. If you lack confidence in reading aloud, the fact that you are reading with your child is what matters. Talk about the illustrations and contribute where you can. Share your excitement for reading and this will be the model your child will adopt.
